Brainstormed Ideas - To Be Considered

1. Law enforcement training in the building during the summer months
2. Don't limit ideas to best practices locally – look for national best practices
3. Additional surveillance cameras and more proactive monitoring of those cameras
4. Safety drills at times when students are in large group areas or are outside for activities

5. Safety plan training for substitutes and PTO volunteers who use the buildings
6. Large and easy to read door numbers
7. Enhanced entry procedures (see questionnaire)
8. Additional School Resource Officers – one per building
9. The ability of staff members to call their own lockdown
10. Concern for the ratio of mental health professionals to students
11. Safety plan training for the after-school care providers
12. Train all staff members for emergencies
13. Family Support Center
14. Staff and students to carry identification when sheltering in a secondary site
15. Improve post-incident procedures, debriefs
16. Drill emergency procedures when students are in each of their assigned classes during the nine-period day
17. Provide law enforcement access to the surveillance cameras
18. Cameras that are triggered by motion – “shot spotters”
19. Restricted access in the buildings prior to the school day supervisor arrives
20. Increase communication with parents regarding incidents (letter or information on web page)
21. Add personnel at the vestibule at each school – once person is buzzed into the first set of doors, personnel can assess the person before entering through the second set of doors.
22. Once in the building, personnel walk visitor to the office. Visitor presents a government ID and it is scanned for criminal background – then a photo visitor pass with picture ID is printed.
